Set Bag Checklist

When I head to set, I like to be prepared for just about ANYTHING.

Sure, there will be days when your filming schedule is quick and you're in and out.

There will however, be other days, when you find yourself in your trailer for 8 hours.

After 20+ years in this business, I've learned that it is better to have and NOT need, than to need and NOT have.

Ya feel me?

I bring everything on this list in a small carry-on size suitcase. This is my dedicated SET SUITCASE. It typically stays in my car during a busy shooting schedule.

The key is to bring everything you need to make your time on set as comfortable as possible so that you can operate in your full zone of genius as an Actor.

And remember, no one will see the contents of your bag but you.

Here's a list of some of my standard set bag items in no particular order.

Be sure to add to this list as you see fit.

1. Sheet for the couch (because you don't know who or what has sat on that couch before you.)
2. Slippers
3. Socks
4. Pantyhose
5. Disinfectant wipes
6. Unscented lotion / Shea Butter / Cocoa Butter
7. Passport / ID (Production will need to verify your identity.)
8. Mirror
9. Brush
10. Wig Cap
11. Gel / Edge control
12. Makeup (yes, makeup. Just in case the makeup artist does not have your shade. Or maybe because you have a favorite lipstick you know looks great on you.)
13. Book to read
14. Reading light (For when it gets dark or when you're on a dark set.)
15. Script
16. Earbuds
17. Laptop / Tablet
18. Cell phone charger (plug in + portable)
19. Pens + highlighters
20. Snacks
21. Lunch (especially if you have special dietary restrictions.)
22. Deodorant

23. Change of undergarments
24. Scarf
25. Gloves (for those cold, outdoor nights.)
26. Candle (be sure NOT to leave it burning if you're not in your trailer.)
27. Air freshener (In case you stink up the joint. LOL)
28. Crochet needle and yarn.
29. Toothbrush, toothpaste and floss.
30. Washcloth and towel.
31. Sanitary pads/tampons
32. Advil / Tylenol
33. Tissue
34. Body Makeup (If you know you have excessive scarring you want to cover.)
35. Neck pillow (For those long wait times.)
36. Smaller "set bag" or purse. (This is a MUCH smaller bag that you actually bring on set with you. This bag will stay in your cast chair and might need to be moved around while shooting. Do not bring anything too valuable with you.)
